## Director's Message



Hi,

I am Jay Greenberg, the new AHA Region 2 Director. This is the first quarterly newsletter that Region 2 has published in awhile, but going forward, we will publish a newsletter shortly after each quarterly Region 2 board meeting.

**Introduction:** Since some of you know me and some do not, I thought I'd introduce myself. My wife Kit and I got involved with Arabian Horses when our eldest daughter was a teenager and became obsessed with horses. We arranged for her to do a summer internship with the Laceys. She learned a bunch and earned a significant discount on an Arabian mare. We bought the mare, and they began to show. When it was time for our daughter to go to Cal Poly, she decided to focus on her studies and leave the mare at home. After a short time, the Laceys encouraged Kit and me to take lessons. Over a relatively short time, we began to show, grew our herd to eight purebreds Arabians and Half-Arabians, and with Gil and Joey Chavez's help, became competitive at the regional and national level. We have shown our horses open and AOTR in Western, English, Country English, Driving, Trail and Halter classes, and we have a nice collection of regional championships and reserves as well as national top 10s. We also enjoy taking our horses on trail rides. Our current herd includes a Half-Arabian Western horse and four purebreds Arabians: two Western, one Park/Driving and one Country English. I think it is fair to say that we caught the Arabian bug from our daughter, and that is why a strong Youth program is so important to growing our breed.

Prior to being elected as Region 2 Director, I was the Vice Director for two years.

In my business career, I started out as a software engineer but quickly moved into engineering, marketing and support management and then executive positions. Currently, I am the Executive VP of a small company that trains people how to day trade commodity futures. Before that, I was Senior VP of Marketing for Synopsys – a \$1B+ semiconductor chip design software company - and VP of Marketing and Sales for Taiwan Semiconductor – an \$8B chip fabrication company. I was also a VP and Senior Partner with an international consulting company.

I remain an active programmer. ## ***Motions Passed at the January 5, 2013, Quarterly Delegates' Meeting***

The minutes of the November 3 Delegates' meeting and the Treasurer's 2012 report were approved and accepted.

Within the Director's report, Jay Greenberg reiterated that will not make any payments without an invoice or receipt and payment is for as per our Bylaws and Policy requirements. In addition he indicated that the check and/or invoice should also indicated what approved budget item should be charged.

The 2013 proposed budget was presented, tweaked and approved. Motion made Jeff Reichman and seconded by Vicky Rich.

The final Bylaws revisions were presented, discussed briefly, and approved by the Delegates. Motion made by Stephanie Bennett and seconded by Lorry Wagner.

Dory Kline brought forth a motion to give the immediate past Director a thank you gift of a life membership in AHA. Motion made by Dory Kline and seconded by Ray Cerniga and approved by the Delegates.

Penny Wardlaw made a motion to rescind all previous motions pertaining to the Region 2 website. Motion seconded by Joyce Schroeder and approved by the Delegates.

## ***Director's Report***

### **AHA Convention Highlights:**

Here are the highlights from the November, 2012, AHA Convention in Aurora, Colorado.

In Lance Walters' final address as President, he made the following points:

- AHA's financial situation is improving though it may take four years to recover completely.
- 2012 was the third year in a row with surplus cash, and AHA expects a 2013 surplus of \$100k.
- There was a \$760K inter-account balance improvement.
- AHA hired a new Sr. Director of Marketing: Bill Harless; previously, he held executive positions with the Pony Club and American Airlines.
- AHA will have free advertising on six rotating billboards around the U.S.
- A new AHA website is planned for 2013.

Cynthia Richardson of Colorado was elected the new AHA President, and Nancy Harvey of Region 1 was elected the new Vice President. A resolution to increase individual dues was withdrawn, and another to synchronize all renewals at the beginning of each fiscal year was defeated. Many resolutions to clean up rules were passed. Additionally, a resolution to discourage questionable transfers to facilitate AOTR rides passed and will be implemented through the Probable Cause and EPRB mechanisms.

## ***Bylaws ad hoc Committee***

An ad hoc Bylaws committee was appointed to configure proper wording to bring our bylaws into conformance with the previously voted motion to explore the changing our existing process of replacing a vacancy occurring in the position of Vice Director from one of appointment by Director followed by approval of said appointment by the Delegates to being elected by the Delegates. Members appointed by Director Jay Greenberg are Jeff Reichman and Penny Wardlaw to report back at the upcoming April 6, 2013, meeting.

A Nominating Committee was formed to bring forth a Vice Director candidate(s) if this Bylaws change is accepted by the Delegates at that April meeting. Committee members are Kelly Elm, Dory Kline, Nedra Johnson, Joyce Schroeder, and Ray Cerniga.

## ***Endurance Challenge***

In an effort to encourage the Arabian / Half-Arabian Endurance community to join and participate in the organization which protects and governs the heritage of the horses that they ride, Region 2 of the Arabian Horse Association is presenting the following challenge to the Arabian / Half-Arabian Endurance community.

Join an AHA Region 2 local club as a competition card holding member, ride a registered Arabian/Half- and Anglo-Arabian in four (4) endurance rides (Limited Distances included) and receive a Region 2 Endurance Challenge Bronze Level award. Ride in six (6) rides and receive a Region 2 Endurance Challenge Silver Level award. Ride in eight (8) rides and receive a Region 2 Endurance Challenge Gold Level award. Ride in ten (10) rides and receive a Region 2 Endurance Challenge Platinum Level award. A Region 2 Endurance Challenge High Mileage award will be awarded to the rider with the highest mileage ridden during the year. There will be one high mileage award for endurance and one high mileage award for limited distance. The miles track with the rider and riders will receive one award for the season.

Sound easy? That is how it should sound. This is Region 2's way of asking for your support in promoting Arabian / Half- and Anglo-Arabian horses as the world's most lovable and versatile breed.

## Endurance Challenge (Cont')

In 2012 there were 26 participants and 18 received awards. The Platinum Level award had 15 winners, the Gold Level had 1 winner and the Bronze Level had 2 winners. The Platinum Award was a choice of a Griffin's Half Bale Bag or Crew Bag, the Gold Award was a Griffin's 4-row trailer organizer, the Silver Award was a Griffin's 3-row trailer organizer and the Bronze Award was a Griffin's 2-row trailer organizer. Each participant was able to choose their own color. The Limited Distance and Endurance high-mileage winners received embroidered vests. Previous year's awards have been jackets, vests, horse blankets and other useful items.

## Equine Stress

At the AHA convention this year, I spent most of my time attending the meetings of the USEF Rules and the ESRE committees.

The USEF Rules committee presented multiple resolutions for the purpose of simplifying references in the USEF Rule Book. In this manner, rather than having to go to a particular Chapter or Rule for a reference, the Rule Book will actually quote the Rule within the Arabian Section. This will be a great help to Secretaries, Stewards, Judges, and Exhibitors.

Rebecca Fleck, Chair of the ESRE committee conducted an excellent meeting during which she had questions about some of the "prohibited drugs" under USEF rules. Some need to be clarified and I may be helping her with that.

Myron Krause was appointed as ESRE Chair for 2013 by Cynthia Richardson, the new AHA President.

Janice Decker will remain as the Chair of the USEF Rules committee.

There was discussion about practices that approached over stressing of horses, particularly in the warm up rings at shows. This involved not only extreme lounging times, but excess riding.

The issue of inappropriate and over use of medications also was surfaced. Unfortunately, as of this date, other than testing for drugs, there is little regulatory control on the administration of them, either by the trainer, owner, or veterinarian.

Following this report is an article which I sent to the ESRE committee entitled,

### *"The Unwilling Recipient"*

I know that I am treading on dangerous waters, but, all of the parties that administer such drugs, etc., need to be

responsible for their actions. Thus, such party, or parties need to fit into our Code of Ethics within AHA, and be held accountable for their actions. It is only after this Resolution gets implemented, will a Charge of Violation be able to be sent to the Probable Cause Panel (PCP) of AHA. If this Charge has merit, the PCP will forward this Charge to the Ethical Practices Review Board (EPRB). If, and when, this happens, the EPRB can make decisive decisions based upon the merits of the Charge.

It would be highly interesting to sit in on a conversation in the kitchen, during the reading of a letter received that same day from the Judges and Stewards Commissioner (JSC) of the Arabian Horse Association (AHA).

### **The Unwilling Recipient!**

Mom and Dad have just sat down with their teenage daughter who rides a Pure Bred Arabian gelding in Hunter Pleasure Classes. The daughter is planning to participate and exhibit her horse, "Ibn", at the AHA Youth Nationals Horse Show in New Mexico. The letter was sent in regards to Ibn. Ibn had won several good ribbons at a series of AHA horse shows, and this was their best opportunity to go to the Youth Nationals. Wow!! What a great deal.

Following multiple years of teeth gnashing amongst the Arabian community, the Equine, Stress/Research and Education Committee (ESRE) took the bull by the horns and developed a workable formula to protect our horses, *"The Unwilling Recipient."*

The ESRE Committee worked a detailed plan of action in order to get their resolutions approved by the AHA membership at the Annual Convention of AHA. The committee addressed multiple issues and concerns that fell under their purview.

**Stress:** In collaboration with the USEF and its' various committees, the ESRE Committee developed and implemented procedures for "Rules of Conduct." These rules were developed in part, but, not exclusively, to include training procedures, lounging times,

tail weights, etc., that are consistent with the humane handling of our animals, prior to, during, and following their competition.

USEF Stewards who best have opportunity to observe and record actions in the warm-up rings, other areas, barn aisles, and stalls, now have the authority to bring any adverse training techniques, or actions to a halt and make the decision stay in place.

**Education:** Such a broad topic, but the exhibitor needs to know what products are being administered to their animals, the real reason for such application and the subsequent effect on the animal.

**Research:** Who should be penalized, and what are the parameters.

**Horse:** Firstly, it is "The Unwilling Recipient." This animal could probably use the rest from the strenuous training and competition. Consider a period of 90-day prohibition to exhibit in any AHA event.

**Trainer:** Whether professional or amateur, their violation needs to become part of the public record for all to see.

**Veterinarian:** Today, they are exempt from any regulations, be it AHA or USEF. Beth Minnich had a great comment in an email in which she stated the lack of accountability.

It is incumbent that AHA send forward a signal from the Association taking a firm, dedicated, and **pro-active plan of action** in establishment of certain rules of the road. The AHA Code of Ethics and Sportsmanship must be reviewed, analyzed, and changed.

If the AHA Code of Ethics and Sportsmanship (EPRB) are changed to include many of the issues listed above, the guilty parties could be charged for the particular violation(s) and appear before the Ethical Practices Review Board (EPRB). This

Board would have the power to prohibit a veterinarian who has been determined to have violated the Code of Ethics from practicing veterinary medicine at all AHA Horse shows and events for a specific period. This would have a major impact, and this may be hard to get established. But, it is doable.

I had proposed portions of the above to one of the USEF committees a few years ago, and my suggestions were met on ears that were not only deaf, but non-responsive

Professional Horsemen and women were well represented at the Convention this year. There was a great deal of discussion at several meetings regarding "Leveling the playing field". Judges and Stewards Commissioner Stan Morey, Christine Ryan and Jim Hitt presented a proposed list of Open and Amateur divisions as a starting point. Much like the Select Rider classes, the divisions would be based on previous wins rather than age, with a few exceptions; one being that the 55 and over would remain as it is, but with a new name - Prime Time. This leveling concept was extremely well received by all, yes all. As far as I know, there is no set date yet. There is a great deal to be worked out and AHA would like your input.

### **Youth Club Reports**


